

THE NGPA IMPLEMENTING RULES AND REGULATIONS (IRR)

IRR

Within one hundred eighty (180) days from the promulgation of RA No. 12900.

Standard Forms

Within **ninety (90) days**of the approval of the
IRR, the standard forms
for procurement shall be
developed and
approved.







TRANSITORY PROVISION

Prior to the effectivity of the Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) of Republic Act No. 12009, the provision of Republic Act No. 9184 and its IRR shall remain in force and effect in order to ensure the continued implementation of programs, activities, and projects.

The GPPB and all HoPE, Procuring Entities and the BACs, affected by this Act shall be given a <u>three (3)-year transitory period from the approval of the standard forms for procurement</u> to fully comply with the requirements of this Act.







Mandatory use of video recording for all procurement-related conferences







- 1. All procurement-related conferences for Competitive Bidding, which includes pre-procurement conference, pre-bid conference, bid opening, and other meetings of the BAC.
- 2.Livestream the preliminary examination and the opening of the bids to the public on the PE website, social media account, or any other form of live streaming services.
- 3. *Threshold*: Above Ten million pesos (Goods), above Twenty million pesos (Infrastructure Projects), and above (Consulting Services)

Public Monitoring and Observer Participation

institutionalizes the role of Civil Society Organizations in monitoring procurement activities



Participatory Procurement

ensures public monitoring is integral to the procurement process







An online platform that enables PEs to easily invite observers; and allows users **Observers to easily participate** in the public procurement process, access procurement information, and submit reports—all with just a click of a button.





Beneficial Ownership Declaration

bidders to declare beneficial ownership information

Beneficial Owners: a natural person who:

(1) ultimately owns or dominantly influences the management or policies of the juridical entity; or (2) exercises ultimate effective control over the juridicial entity.







Disclosure of Relations

All Bidding Documents shall be accompanied by a sworn affidavit of the bidder that he or she, any partner, member of the board, or officer of the juridical entity is not related to the HoPE; the members of the BAC, the TWG, and the BAC Secretariat, the head of the Project Management Office or the end-user unit or implementing unit and the project consultants of the Procuring Entity, or of the procurement agent, whichever is applicable, by consanguinity or affinity up to the third civil degree. In order to determine the ultimate beneficiary and prevent collusion, the ultimate beneficial ownership of an entity shall be disclosed by the bidder.



<u>Declaration of Beneficial Ownership</u>

Notwithstanding the provisions of Republic Act No. 10173, legal entities like corporations, partnerships, private sector organizations, foundations, and associations that participate in procurement projects shall safeguard the government from all acts that undermine a transparent, fair, and competitive procurement process. The beneficial ownership information of the suppliers, manufacturers, distributors, contractors, or consultants shall be a requirement to participate in government procurement. The GPPB shall maintain an online registry of beneficial ownership information of bidders established for government procurement which shall be accessible to the public.

Institutionalize the role of procurement policy as driver for the achievement of our Sustainable Development Goals, particularly, Sustainable Consumption and Production, as well as enhance competitiveness through inclusive supplier engagement.



Adoption of gender-responsive strategies in procurement policies which include promoting competition and inclusivity through market study enhancement, streamlining business registration and licensing, standardizing supplier payments through review of payment rules, capacity development and mentoring, establishment of a supplier database, leveraging technology for market access, and stakeholder engagement

Selection based on Quality Criteria

Flexibility in Procurement Methods

flexibility to select the most appropriate procurement methods based on specific needs and objectives









Mandatory Market Scoping

Conduct market scoping as a preliminary step in preparing their Project Procurement Management Plan and gathering relevant market information to inform procurement decisions effectively







Fit-for-Purpose Approach

Ensures that procurement processes are tailored to meet specific project needs, promoting flexibility, efficiency, and value for money while maintaining transparency and accountability









NEW MODALITIES: COMPETITIVE DIALOGUE

Two-stage bidding process where the PE invites suppliers, manufacturers, distributors, contractors, consultants, and service providers to a dialogue to propose solutions to address its needs and requirements.











NEW MODALITIES: UNSOLICITED OFFER WITH BID MATCHING

PE may consider unsolicited officers on a negotiated basis for Goods and Consilting Services.











NEW MODALITIES: DIRECT ACQUISITION

PE may procure directly from any known reputable source, its required non-CSEs and CSEs not available in the PS-DBM and services with an ABC not exceeding Php 200,000.00, subject to compliance with the identified legal, technical, and financial requirements.











NEW MODALITIES: DIRECT SALES


PE directly purchases non-CSEs from a supplier that has satisfactorily delivered non-CSEs to another government agency under a completed contract.












NEW MODALITIES: DIRECT PROCUREMENT FOR SCIENCE, TECHNOLOGY, AND INNOVATION

PE may procure goods and services used in the conduct of research and development projects or activities directly from a qualified manufacturer or a supplier, or from a qualified startup business.









Most Economically Advantageous Responsive Bid (MEARB)

New Bid Evaluation/Award Criterion: Allows for a rated criteria in the selection of a winning bidder.




